

## Students Instructions for making a gold standard file

- Download the GS (Gold Standard) file from the link onto your hard drive.
  - “Feedback” is self-graded practice
  - Anything labelled “graded” or “test” is an assignment
- Upload the GS file into Perseids, using NEW TREEBANK ANNOTATION > “Choose file” [at the bottom of the page]
- Make your trees. SAVE often!
- Go to the Sentence List page for that file. Use CHANGE TITLE to rename it something recognizable (e.g., chapter 1.3 GS sentences)
- For self-grading, go to the Sentence List page for that file. OVERVIEW > Compare [very bottom of page]. Once in your individual sentences, click on the Review tab [far right] > compare. Mistakes/discrepancies will appear in red.
- Remember that, just because something is marked in red does not necessarily mean that it is wrong. The key could contain mistakes and, more importantly, there are often multiple correct answers, since language is a complex function that is often rendered ambiguously. Think about the “mistakes” and decide whether it truly is wrong or whether it is a reasonable rendering based on your knowledge of grammar and syntax. Use grammars and the LSJ to justify your version, if you think you are correct..
